World Premiere Works

Presented by Robert Wallace Laird & Stuart James



Until the RSMC's concert in April, I'd not heard any works by either Robert Wallace Laird or Stuart James. I had no idea what to expect. Would the music be aggressive, emotionally dark, superficially trivial, austere or dauntingly complex?

With Paul Wright leading the *Sartory String Quartet*, we listened to four works by Laird, all being given their first public performances. There was an almost palpable sense of anticipation as the musicians gripped their bows and took us into a quiet sonic world. So often, music of the 21st century – and earlier, for that matter – can, and does, sound violently confrontational and gratingly dissonant. But this was a sonic experience of a very different kind: soothing, introspective music that caressed the ear. (Laird's Quartet No 4 [Variations on Kai's Theme] is incomplete: the composer hopes to write a further three variations.)

Stuart James was at the keyboard for the first performance of his piano quintet – A Song for my Beloved. It unfolded very slowly, an essay in quietness.

Laird's Lullaby (also for piano quintet) with the composer at the keyboard was informed by harmonies that called the orient to mind. Pizzicato was a feature in music that came across as a gently melancholic statement.

Castanets, C(h)ords & Keys

Deanna Blacher OAM is that rarity: a virtuoso on the castanets. Believed to be the only such musician in Australia, Deanna has performed internationally as soloist with chamber and symphony orchestras and to piano accompaniment.



A recital for castanets and piano in Cape Town launched a career originally in parallel with her

work as dancer, choreographer and dance company director. Zubin Mehta heard her in performance and invited her to perform as castanets soloist with the Israel Philharmonic Orchestra which launched an international career. Conductor Enrique Garcia Asensio has often presided over orchestral concerts featuring Deanna as soloist. Numbers of composers - Spanish, British and South African - have written castanets concertos for Deanna.

At her recital for the Royal Schools Music Club Deanna will be accompanied at the piano by Neville Cohn. A fascinating program includes sonatas by Spanish baroque composers such as Padre Antonio Soler, Narciso Casanovas (a rather awkward name for a Benedictine monk) and Cantallos. There will also be music by Granados and Manuel de Falla.

For her services to Spanish dance and her astonishing skills as a castanets virtuoso, Deanna was awarded a Lifetime Achievement Award by Ausdance. In 2011 she received an OAM for services to the performing arts and also the Cross of the Order of Civil Merit from King Juan Carlos of Spain.
